



Mandatory learning offer

Dear parents in Gellerup and Toveshøj

Remember that you must register your child for a place in day nursery or child-minding no later than three months before he/she turns one year.

If you do not, the law states that your child must start a mandatory learning offer.

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Sign your child up to a spot in a nursery or daycare

You must sign your child up to a spot in a nursery or daycare, no later than three months before their first birthday. You do that on the website of the office assigning daycare aarhus.dk/skrivop

It is important that you sign up your child to start in the month of their first birthday

Economical free space

You have the possibility of applying for an economical free space and have the fee reduced for the care of your child.

A safe start in nursery or daycare

When your child starts in a nursery or daycare, the personnel will make sure that both you and your child, get a safe start. The everyday consists of both free play and common activities. Your child will get friends, practice the Danish language and will become part of a community. Children who have attended nursery or daycare, often do well when they transition into school.

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The mandatory learning offer

If your child is not signed up for a place in a nursery or daycare before the deadline, it will have to start in a mandatory learning offer.

In the mandatory learning offer, your child will participate in the daily activities and routines of the nursery.

Furthermore, the learning offer includes:

- Your child must attend the nursery 25 hours a week.
- Your child must participate in a course where it learns about Danish traditions, holidays and values. The course will also focus on your child's language, learning and development.
- Both parents must participate in a mandatory supervision plan in collaboration with the nursery.
- The mandatory learning offer is free, but you must pay for food and bring diapers.
- According to §44f, subsection 3 of the Day Care Act, you have the opportunity to take care of your child yourself. The care must live up to the same requirements as the municipal offer. The care will be under supervision.

Mandatory attendance for parents and children

You must pay attention to that parents and child both have mandatory attendance.

That means if your child fails to attend, or if you as parents do not participate in the planned supervision plan, it will mean a termination of your child support.
